From concept to code, every decision, from storyline to graphics, was their own. They tackled real-world issues like pollution, conservation, and climate change through digital storytelling, transforming urgent environmental messages into interactive gameplay.

More than just a tech challenge, EcoPy was a space for peer collaboration, rapid problem-solving, and turning code into climate action. It wasn't about perfection; it was about progress, purpose, and student-powered innovation.
