Visit to NHEDF

The Junior Red Cross Circle along with the Coordinator, Mrs. Durga Karki, were taken to Nepal Healthcare Equipment Development Foundation (NHEDF), located at Panipokhari on 1st June 2016. NHEDF is looking after victims of the 2015 earthquake who were discharged from hospitals almost immediately due to lack of space. They are providing them with post-trauma recovery, and have been helping to rehabilitate the victims by providing free shelter, food and psychological support. The students observed the environment, gathered information, and interacted with the officials and the victims as well. They were very touched by their stories and this visit turned out to be very fruitful.

Inter-House Debate Contest

The contest, which aimed to enhance students' argumentative as well as reasoning skills, had participant students representing their respective Houses. In the Intermediate Level, Bidhya Thapa (Grade VII) of Begnas House, and Astitwa Raj Wagle (Grade VII) also of Begnas House were declared as the Best Debaters in the Nepali and English Category respectively. Among the Seniors, Sampada Uprety (Grade X) of Tilicho House, and Sandhya Nirola (Grade IX) also of Tilicho House, were adjudged the Best Debaters in the Nepali and English category respectively.

Inter-School Chess Competition at Triyog



On the occasion of World Olympic Day, we organized the Inter-School Chess Competition in which 13 schools and around 100 students participated on the 16th & 17th June, 2016. The Chief Guests were Mr. Bishnu Gopal Shrestha, President of Sports for All Nepal Olympic Committee, and Mr. Ek Lal Shrestha, President of Nepal Chess Association. Mr. Manoj Ghimire, who has refereed national as well as international competitions, was the referee for our event. There were 3 categories divided into the Boys and Girls Division for grades IV & V, VI & VII, and VIII – X respectively. The winners were handed over certificates and medals at the end of the competition.

Participation in Inter-School Chess Competition

Our students participated in the Inter-School Chess Competition organized by Annapurna Higher Secondary School on the 15th & 16th June 2016. Out of the 31 schools and 240 students that had taken part, three of our students were able to secure positions in the Top 10. Tejaswini Tamang of grade IX stood fourth, Debesha Thapa of grade VII stood sixth, and Sambriddhi Silwal stood ninth. The contest remained a milestone in enhancing inter-school kinship and providing additional exposure to the students to explore their skill.

Inter -School Marathon

As a part of Olympic Day Celebration, GEMS school had organized the Inter School Road Marathon on 18th June 2016 where around 200 students participated. Animesh Manandhar and Aaryan Singh of grade X participated from our school. Aaryan secured the 7th position in the Marathon.

Project Day KG - III





KG presented on the topic "Shapes and Colors" where they made a model of a building using different shapes cut out on paper. The topic for grade I was "Animals- Domestic and Wild". They recited poems, sang song on farm animals and also gave speeches on the importance of animals. There was also an exhibition on the model of habitats of farm and wild animals.

For grade II the topic was "From the Farm to the Table". The students presented on the usefulness of the plants with focus on food that we get from them. They also prepared food items – vegetable sandwich, fruit salad, and lemonade for the parents and teachers. Grade III presented on "Parts of the Plant and their Functions". They recited poems, sang songs on plants, demonstrated on the leaf, and also carried out experiments on transferring the nutrients from roots to the different parts of a plant. It further encouraged the students to search for practical implication of their learning.
