Field Visits

Understanding of Accounting Practices



Students of Grade IX 'A' and IX 'B' (Accountancy and Economics) visited National Plastic Udhog in Balaju Industrial Area to explore real-world applications of economic and accounting concepts. They observed the plastic manufacturing process, raw material use, and quality control while gaining insights into business operations, cost management, and industrial challenges.

Kindergarteners to Aviation Museum



The kindergarten students took a theme-based trip to the Aviation Museum in Sinamangal. The primary objective of the visit was to explore the various jobs within the aviation industry. They explored the interior of a real airplane and its compartments. In addition to learning about aviation-related roles, the kindergarteners also observed professionals who are involved in other fields of an airport like shopkeepers, ticket checkers, waiters, security guards, etc.

Recognition of Local Products



The students of Grade III visited the Suryadaya Cane and Bamboo Industry as a part of their exploration under the topic Local Products. They saw and learned how bamboo can be used to make useful items. This visit helped them understand the eco-friendly nature of bamboo and its importance in local industries.

Little Flowers at the Garden of Dreams

As Mary did in the story, they too explored different corners of the garden and took pleasure in the happiness brought by the flowers, green plants, butterflies and chipmunks. This experience helped young minds to know the importance of taking care of plants and enjoying the beauty of nature.

First Graders' Exploration at National Museum
