### Asynchronous Learning:


As per the School Calendar for the New Academic Session we started with remote learning from April 22, 2020 in asynchronous mode. Learning content and assignments were uploaded on the School Learning Management System (LMS) by the teachers. Teachers designed activities, collected relevant materials and uploaded in the LMS for students to start learning. The School LMS is continuing to be used for uploading study materials, assignments, and receiving students' assignments, and receiving assginments from student and also for communicating any important messages. Prior to start we ensured that tutorial videos were made available to students and parents, so that they could get used to the "new way" of teaching-learning.

#### **Synchronous Learning:**

The shift from ASYNCHRONOUS to SYNCHRONOUS teaching was a big leap. It required immense effort on the part of teachers and the school administration as a whole new mindset and skills were required.

The Primary Block started synchronous mode of teaching from 4 May. At present Primary Block students are taking three classes per day. Junior School started the synchronous session from 3 May. The Middle School started live interaction with students from 7 May. The initial two weeks were invested to make students comfortable in online platforms. Then, teachers gradually shifted their interaction to academic teaching-learning from May 18. Full-fledged synchronous learning classes for the Senior Block started from 11 May with live interaction between teachers and students. Initially two sessions per day were allotted, and currently the students take four classes per day.

The virtual classes that are being conducted are as per the guidelines of National Curriculum Framework and follow the syllabus structure that is a standard feature of the school. We are continuing to review the framework of online classes to see how we can make them better and more effective with learning outcomes as per the curricular framework.




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#### **Assessment Milestones:**

We have completed one round of online assessment with our students and are currently continuing the second round of Formative and Continuous Assessments. The assessments include written test, oral tests, quizzes, multiple choice questions, projects, class presentations, reading aloud, among others. The students who missed their tests were contacted individually by teachers. The first round of results were disseminated and Parent Teacher Meeting held virtually on 12 September.





#### **Block Assemblies:**



Weekly Block Assemblies are conducted for all students of the school on different days. These assemblies are led by the Captains of the Prefect Body. All teachers, students, In-charges and Principal attend the assemblies. This is a platform for students where they take turns to present and share their knowledge and skills. Besides singing the National Anthem, the School Song, and the Saraswati Vandana the students indulge in presenting activites such as weekly news highlights, English and Nepali poem recitation, prepared speeches, biography-reading of successful people, etc.



















# **Communication with Parents**

### **Parent Orientation Session**

We conducted a Parent Orientation Session in the first week of June to familiarze parents with our teaching-learning process, the technology used in doing so and mechanism of communication with teachers and other officials. Class Teachers made detailed presentation to make parents aware of all the mechanisms used in the teaching-learning process.



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### **Weekly Updates**

The Block In-charges have been sending weekly update emails to parents regularly from May 24 which includes major activities of the week and subject-wise learning outcomes. This is to ensure that parents are aware of the progress made by their children, which is as per the block plan of teaching and learning.

### **Parent Teacher Meeting:**

We invited all parents of school students to discuss the progress of their ward with the Class Teachers and concerned Subject Teachers on 12 September. This virtual session was very helpful for parents and teachers as they could discuss the progress and challenges faced by students and also discussed academic solutions.



### **Meeting with Parent Representatives:**



We conducted a virtual meeting with Parent Representatives from September 24 to 26, 2020. Respective Block In-charges presented the summary of academic and co-curricular achievements made till date. Then, the School Principal made administrative

announcements. Parents were also asked for their feedback one by one. During the meeting, all parents expressed their gratitude to the School family, especially teachers, for the successful conducting of teaching-learning and co-curricular learning activities virtually.







#### **Our Communication Mechanism**

The School Administration has been active in reaching out and communicating with parents via personalized phone calls, especially to students and parents who might be facing difficulties with virtual classes or assignment submissions. This is supplemented by the telephone calls, SMSs, and instant connectivity via Viber. The Block In-charges, Class and Subject Teachers make routine phone calls to support children and parents. Any child or parent seeking the help of teachers or administration is provided immediate help. This ensures that no parent or child associated with Triyog is left behind.



# **Interaction Programs**


Interaction Programs that have been a standard feature of Triyog's Integrated Learning Framework supplements subject content teaching that is conducted by our academic teachers. We believe that meaningful interactions with subject/sector experts and can deepen learning and broaden the thinking horizon of our students.

#### **Primary School**

On 8 July, the students of Grade II had an interaction session with the personnel of "The National Zoo" Jawalakhel. The children learnt about the eating habits of animals, how they are taken care of and how they have been brought to the zoo.

On 5 July Grade II organized an interaction program related to the topic "Profession". Various sector professionals like doctors, engineers, architects, and army officer, were invited to the program. The children came to know about their duties and responsibilities and commitment toward the society.

The students of Grade III had an interactive session with the representative of Ward Office, Ms.Urmila B.K. She explained the responsibilities of the ward office and answered the questions asked by the students. The students were able to collect the information regarding the various activities performed by the Ward office in Ward No. 6.












### **Junior School**

### **Middle School**

Students of Grade VI attended an interaction session with Mr. Kiran Kumar Shrestha, Director of Nepal Electricity Authority and CEO of Sanjen Jalavidhyut Company on 3 September. Mr. Shrestha is also a parent. The interaction was mainly focused on discussing forms of energy and its conservation, invention and development of electricity, hydroelectricity and types of hydropower, sources of electricity and its production process, conductors and insulators, and role of Nepal Electricity Authority. They also learned about uses of electricity and its role in our life and development of the nation. This program was integrated with the Science and Social Studies curriculum under the concept of 'Electricity'.

#### **Senior School**

Dr. Upadhayaya is an educationalist, writer and researcher who worked as the Head of Department of History at Tribhuvan University and as a member of University Council and University Commission. He is a prominent author of numerous books on Nepalese and World History. The students were engaged with him learning about his fascinating experience of Nepalese history from the primitive age to the modern time. Professor Upadhayaya's mysterious facts and episodes about our history made the session twice as more fun and enticing. The program was coordinated and moderated by Mr. Prakash Pant, senior school Social Studies teacher.

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




### **Interaction with Charimaya Tamang**

She also put forward facts on newer forms of human trafficking, role of Shakti Samuha and even about her personal life story. The session not only provided insights on understanding Human Trafficking issue but also acted as a fantastic motivation and inspiration to all that attended. The session was moderated by senior school Social Studies teacher, Mr. Prakash Pant.









# **Experiential Learning Activities**

### **Projects and Experiments**

Based on the topics taught in the class, students were assigned with projects for deeper understanding of the topics. At the completion of the project, each child was given an opportunity to present their findings and share their project during the live virtual classes. Some of the projects done by the various Grades are listed below.

### KG

The students made booklets as projects on topics such as Shapes, Wild Animals, Domestic Animals, Water Animals.

### Grade I

The students of Grade I were given to make booklets, 3D models, photo frames, birthday calendar, on topics such as Shapes Around Me, All About Spiders, My Farm, My Family.











### **Grade II**

The students of Grade II were given projects to create booklets, 3D models, Photo Gallery, Cooking activity on topics like - My Favorite Dish, Event of my Life, My Neighborhood, Germination of Seeds, When I was Young in the City.





### **Grade III**

The students of Grade III were given projects on topics like - My Family Tree, Leaf, Adaptation of Animals to their Natural Environment, Roots, Flowering and non-flowering plants, Natural Habitats of Plants, Bird Feeder, Natural Habitat of Animals, Feeding Plants.





### Movie Screening Wall-E

Wall-E was screened for the students of Grade IV. It is a movie based on an imaginary robot responsible for cleaning the earth. From this movie, children learnt about the growing problems of pollution and waste faced by our Mother Earth, making these young minds aware about the destruction caused by humans.





### **Because of Winn-Dixie**

"Because of Winn-Dixie" was screened for the students of Grade V which helped them to get the clear insight on what the novel is all about. This movie is based on their course.











#### **Environment Week**

Students from the Junior Block held an environment week - conducting various activities such as creating an environmental awareness video, planting plants, and making homemade compost during the environment week. Students picked up quite a few gardening techniques, while growing close to nature at the same time.

The students also constructed a bird feeder as an extended project-based-learning approach to the topic "Our Environment". Using reusable materials like plastic bottles, toilet paper and cardboard boxes, children made bird feeder and hung it in their garden/terrace. They were delighted knowing that their small efforts will result in a massive impact on nature conservation.



### **My Gratitude Tree**

Students from the Junior Block learned to be thankful and appreciative of all the people who had helped them so far in their life by making a "My Gratitude Tree."



### Mindfulness

Students from the Junior Block explored the meaning, techniques, benefits and art of practicing meditation in our life.



### **Social Awareness**

Integrating Wellness Session with Social Studies, a short movie on Chhaupadi was screened in the Junior School. After watching the movie, the children realized that they should be thankful for the wonderful life they currently have at the same time they were also made aware of such malpractices in their country.









### **360 Virtual Tours: Complemented with Mindfulness**

Mindfulness is the quality or state of being conscious or aware of something. We combined a mindfulness activity with a virtual tour to the Amazon forest. In the video an indigenous local member of a village gives a tour. In the tour students take an almost life-like feel of hiking through the forest, rowing on a boat and many others. The students thoroughly enjoyed the 360 degree videos where they learned about the mighty Amazon forest, and took a virtual tour through the life-like videos. Learners were taken for virtual field trips to understand the importance of biodiversity and famous touristic destinations of the nation.







### **Learning Basic Life Skills**

'Wellness Sessions' that are conducted once a week in the Junior School focus on the development of soft skills and enabling them to learn the rudimentary life skills essential for a good life. We help our children in grooming these fundamental skills which can't be learned solely through academics. There are lots of opportunities to learn from, while staying at home too. This is a fantastic example of teacher-parent-children partnership.

### **Class Dojo**

Class Dojo is an online behavior management system which has been introduced in the Junior School that is intended to develop positive student behaviors and classroom culture in an online classroom setting. Students earn 'Dojo Points' based on their classroom conduct and assignments. This application helps track students' socio-emotional growth and progress. Additionally, parents can see the progress made by their children instantly through a parent login account.





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### **Interview on Gender Equality**

Hosted by students, an online interview was conducted between their parents and other family members on the topic of "Gender Equality." The interaction was an opportunity for the students to understand a bit more about the structure of society we are currently living in while having meaningful conversations with their family members.









### **Financial Literacy**

In a session about "Bachat Garnay Bani" learners were taught about the benefits of developing the habit of saving. To enforce that habit, the children were asked to show their savings gradually increase inside their piggy bank.



### **Dignity of Labour**

As a goodwill gesture and to teach our learners that all occupations and professions should be equally respected, they were asked to make a 'Thank You Card' for the people of different occupations. Through their cards, they expressed their gratitude to the real heroes of our society like doctors, nurses, police, media persons, garbage collectors, for their selfless services.









# Live Virtual Trips

### Grade I Visit to the Tiger Lily Petting Farm

On 2 July, children of Grade I had a virtual tour to Tiger Lily Farm, where they interacted with the founder and owner of the farm Mr Rajendra Upreti. Mr. Upreti helped the children take a tour of the farm, virtually. The visit was based on the topic 'Farm animals' which added knowledge to the children about farmers, farm and farm animals. They also learnt about the different habitats that can be created in a single farm.

### **Grade I Visit to a Joint Family**

On 20 August, the children of Grade I had a virtual visit to one of their classmate's family. This was based on the theme "My Family" as a part of their curriculum. During this visit, they were introduced to all the family members of the joint family. They learnt about the role and contribution of each family member. 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


### **Grade I Visit to Triyog High School**

# Grade III Visit to Ghandruk (Mountainous region), Sankhuwasawa (Hilly region) & Parsa (Terai region)

The students of grade III were taken to the live virtual tour under the topic "Landforms" on 28, 30, and 31 August. They visited Ghandruk of the Mountainous Region, Sankhuwasabha of the Hilly Region and Parsa of Terai Region. They observed the lifestyles of these places where they got to know about the food and crops, clothing, animal husbandry, roads, types of houses, sources of income, festivals and the special utensils. Our students interacted with the local people of those places and collected a lot of firsthand information.

















### Grade III Visit to the Zoo (Bird section)

On 3 and 4 September, the students of Grade III went for a virtual tour of the zoo. Mrs. Renuka Bhandari shared the information on species of birds, natural habitat, food habits, adaptation, types of beaks and claws, lifespan, movement, distance and the height covered by birds while flying and conservation of wildlife.





### **Grade IV Bingo Activity**

To embed in the students the attitude of responsibility and positive behavior, learners from Grade IV were handed a "Let's help each other Bingo" and asked to perform the tasks mentioned in it. They did all those tasks: making their beds, polishing their shoes, creating thank you cards for their parents and a lot more with so much dedication and enthusiasm - it was truly heartwarming for us to see the happiness these simple acts of care could bring to a family.














### **Grade VI visit to Floriculture Farm**

# Drop Everything and Read (D.E.A.R.) Program










### **Annual Investiture Ceremony**

# **Professional Development**

### **Regular Workshops and Trainings**

### Implementation of Integrated Curriculum Grade I -Pencil Foundation




### **Triyog Gavel Club**


