MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

The aftermath of the earthquake brought Triyogees together like never before. After we were assured that our School building was safe we put our heads together to see where and how we could help in relief efforts as a responsible organization. The School would like to acknowledge the Herculean effort put forth by the newly-formed School Alumni and current students along with teachers. This team worked non-stop from 30th April to 7th May to collect donations from generous parents and residents of Dhapasi and connect with organizations and individuals who were distributing relief materials to affected areas. Triyog School worked as a distribution center where organizations and individuals came to collect relief material such as clothes, dry food and essential medicine. We are proud to have done our share in helping people in affected areas and for this I thank everyone who was involved.

We have had multiple independent inspections of our School building done – first structural engineers form IFID Nepal, than the team from the DEOs office and finally from Design Cell the architectural and engineering firm that designed our School. We have occupied the School building to resume normal academic classes after having ascertained it's structural integrity and safety.

This newsletter brings together snapshots of all effort the School has put through May and June to ensure that our students and staff can come back to a normal school life, along with other highlights. We sincerely appreciate the support and cooperation that our parents and well-wishers have shown during this period. Let me assure you that we will do everything to ensure all student and staff are safe and are a part of a healthy teaching-learning environment.

NEW INITIATIVE IN THE PROGRESSIVE INTEGRATED PROGRAM

We are integrating technology in a big way for teaching-learning and continuous formative assessments for the Integrated Program (Grades I – IV). Our technology partners, 360 Consulting, are working closely with our teachers to ensure that all children are better assessed through the Edcrayon software deployment. Training for Grade IV teachers will continue throughout the entire academic year along with monitoring and feedback sessions. The teachers have also undergone a Behavior and Classroom Management workshop.

OTHER INITIATIVES

In partnership with Karkhana, another education company, we are trying to impact the way teaching-learning is imparted at Triyog. With teacher observation and feedback sessions, every effort is being made to ensure that our teachers are equipped with better resources and teaching methodologies. Ultimately that will positively impact how students learn at School.

Meditation and silent-sitting have been introduced as a compulsory activity throughout the School every morning. The session is facilitated by class teachers. Subject teachers are at liberty to conduct the same as and when possible throughout the School day.

TEACHER TRAINING WITH SPECIAL FOCUS ON TRAUMA RELIEF AND STUDENT REINTEGRATION

Trauma Relief Workshop for Teachers

On the 6th of May, a three-member team from Israel comprising military doctors and disaster management experts visited Triyog for a workshop which enabled our teachers and staff to communicate their experiences following the earthquake and gave valuable insights on how to facilitate initial classroom activities and discussions for students, an important step towards recovery. This initiative has sped up the process of trauma relief among the students and teachers alike. A feeling of security has been instilled in students as they feel safe and protected in the presence

The training program reinforced teachers with tools and techniques for reintegrating our students back into the normal school routine following the natural disaster. This training boosted existing skills in teachers and made them ready to welcome students back to School.

Grades VI and VII joined the seniors from 3^{rd} of June and grades K.G. to 5 from the 7^{th} of June. Disaster Management and Relief Workshop

Senior students were involved in a disaster management workshop on their third day back to school. The Disaster and Relief Management Team of the Armed Police Force conducted a workshop on "Safety measures before, during and post earthquake" for staff and students of class 8, 9 & 10. The students were briefed about the do's and dont's in case of an emergency. The workshop was a success as students felt that it would help them in an emergency. Inspector Bishwanath Pokhrel and Senior Constable Ram Bd.Tamang delivered the presentation.



Earthquake-Safety Drills

In order to ensure their safety, students have been taught appropriate responses in case of an emergency. Everyday, randomly throughout school hours, the students and staff practice drills that are designed to ensure safe and speedy evacuation should any emergency arise. Throughout the duration of the drill, they are guided by the teacher present in the class and are required to cover their heads and crouch in a duck-cover-hold position and then evacuate systematically to the front and backfields away from walls and the school building. Teachers who are not in classes assist in safe and fast evacuation..



Additional Physical Infrastructure for Easy Evacuation

The long term plan of the School is to build additional evacuation infrastructure to ensure safe and fast evacuation from the School building in case of an emergency. Existing back exits will also be widened.



Relief Management

The Alumni, current students, and members of the teaching staff got together from the 30th of April to set up a collection and distribution center within the School premises. The teachers also supported us immensely with this





initiative. Soon we were overwhelmed with heavy inflow of medicine, clothes, dry food supplies - biscuits, noodles, beaten rice, salt, rice, puffed rice, water etc from generous Parents & other well wishers. A team of visiting teachers and students not only came in with supplies but also helped us sort clothes for men, women, and children.

We put in 7 days and over 120 hours of combined volunteer work at School to help the needy. It is actually inspiring to see people of all ages trying to do their bit to help those in need, even when the tremor shook us all. Kudos to all the contributors and I am proud to have been a part of this noble initiative by Triyog H.S.
