#### Workshops for Teachers

## **Basic Life Support**



On 24 September, a workshop on Basic Life Support Skill was conducted to enable teachers to be first responders in case of a medical emergency at school, or in the larger community. The workshop focused on the process of giving CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation), discussed on differences between cardiac arrest and heart attack; and choking management. Prof. Dr. Bishwas Pradhan, MD, FCTA Head, Department of Cardiothoracic Vascular and Transplant Centre, Maharajgunj Medical Campus, Institute of Medicine, Tribhuvan University, Nepal, conducted the session.

## Investigating Ecological Relationship in Educational Context





A workshop on investigating ecological relationship in educational context was held on 26-27 November, 2019. The main objective of the workshop was to shape many assumptions in educational practices in order to bring transformation in our environment practices at a significant level which reflect our lives and implication of these assumptions. Some of the activities like tree of life, movement of body, aromatherapy, brainstorming, critical thinking, and self- reflection skills were discussed and practiced. The concept of "CARE" (Complexity, Aesthetics, Responsibility, and Ethics) featured prominently at the workshop. The discussion ended with the participants postulating their views to create an aspirational tree of life for the school system.

#### Multidisciplinary Integrated Program at Middle School

Under multidisciplinary integrated learning program at Middle School, students learn a topic from the viewpoint of more than one discipline and focus on solving a problem using different disciplinary approaches. This allows them to unify and correlate their learning experiences for life-long learning.

The theme of the most recent multidisciplinary integrated learning program for Grade VI was 'Agriculture'. They connected krishi malko prayog - Nepali, Unitary Method, and Profit and Loss - Mathematics, Life Process - Science, Rice Bowl Wishes and Notice Writing - English, Agricultural activities of Nepal - Social Studies, Kitchen Gardening - OBTE and Spreadsheet software - ICT. They visited an agricultural farm in Lalitpur for practical learning and practiced kitchen gardening at the School Karesabari. A closing event was organized on December 1, 2019 where they shared their experiences and learning evidence

## Integration Project Opening Event at EduFarm - Grade VI





The students of Grade VI visited EduFarm in Chhampi, Lalitpur on November 14 which was marked as the opening ceremony for the project. Students got an opportunity to observe types and techniques of animal and plant farming. They spent some time in the paddy field, animal farms, and interacted with local agroexperts about agricultural practice and use of fertilizers. They also visited agromuseum which contained agricultural tools. They learnt many Nepali words related to agriculture.

## Kalimati and Tokha Farm Visit - Grade VI





Eight students of Grade VI visited Kalimati Fruit and Vegetable Market as well as Tokha Farm on November 25, 2019 as a part of their Integrated Learning Program under the theme 'Agriculture'. Mr. Rohit Pandey, their Mathematics teacher, guided the visit. These visits were significant because the students got to learn the cost difference between farmers and retailers' selling rate of fruits and vegetables. They also calculated the cost of production, transport and sales. Moreover, they had hands-on experience of milking buffaloes at Tokha Farm.

Some children helped the farmers plant the seeds as well. Upon return the children shared their experiences among their friends and in the Morning Assembly too.

## Horticulture Centre - Grade I



On November 22, the students of Grade I along with teachers and some parents visited Horticulture Center, Kritipur to learn, observe and identify different types of plants and food that they get from plants.

## Chobhar - Grade II



On December 6, students of Grade II were taken for a field trip to Chobhar, as an extended learning activity of the book 'The Lorax'. The main objective of this trip was to compare environment before and after development. The children observed surrounding hills and compared that to the more barren, dusty land across the Bagmati river. The children came to the conclusion that trees must have been cut down to construct factories and other buildings in the name of development.

## Laxmi Furniture Grade II



Related to the book 'The Lorax' and 'Dayalu Rukh' (Nepali translation of the 'Giving Tree'), children of Grade II were taken for a short trip on December 2, to the neighboring Laxmi Furniture Factory to learn about the usefulness of wood. The children observed varieties of furniture items and tools used to make furniture. They interviewed the carpenters and came to know about the journey of a tree, from its birth to its usefulness to humans, especially wood and the things we make out of it. Children were also involved in individual book reading activity through which they understood that although, we get lots of useful things from trees we should not cut down the trees unnecessarily as this causes environmental degradation. Similarly, the children also got the message that cutting trees cannot be stopped altogether but can definitely be reduced.

## ICIMOD Godavari Grade III



To make the children learn practically about the sources of energy, on December 9, the students of Grade III visited the ICIMOD at Godawari. They got the chance to observe the process of generating energy from different sources. They also learned about the materials needed to make briquettes, saw things like cooker, heater,

oven and dryers being operated with the help of solar energy and how electricity is generated by hydropower. The trip outcome consisted of the students' learning about the alternative sources of energy, their uses and how they are eco-friendly.

## Horticulture Center, Kirtipur - Grade IV



On December 11 learners from grade IV were taken to Horticulture Center at Kirtipur. Students were able to know and understand the characteristics of different varieties of fruit bearing plants. They also learnt about the process of irrigation. Through this experiential outdoor learning they broadened their conceptual knowledge that they had acquired about plants.
