#### **Achievements and Awards**

#### **Felicitation Program**



Tokha Municipality organized a Felicitation Program for the highest achieving students, teachers and schools of Tokha in last Academic Session, both in community and private sectors, on September 7, 2019 at Sadbhav Banquet, Tokha. Hon. Deputy Prime Minister, Ishwor Pokhrel, felicitated them with medals and certificates in a formal program. Our students and teachers have made us proud by bagging awards in

different subjects and levels for Academic Excellence among private schools. From among the students who appeared BEE in last academic session, Samrat Pant bagged 10th position in Tokha with 84.75 percent. Supriya Joshi bagged 9th position with 84.95 percent, Shreejita Chauhan bagged 5th position with 86.33 percent, and Ritesh Poudel bagged 3rd position with 87.12 percent in external test. From among the students who appeared SEE in last academic session, Avanish Khatri and Niraj Baral were awarded for securing 3.95 GPA, which was the Second Highest GPA in Tokha in SEE of last academic session.

In the same way, our teachers have made us proud by mentoring the students for excellent performance in BEE and SEE.

The highest average score in Moral Education in BEE was 20.4 (out of 25) and this was achieved by Churamani Pandeya. The highest average GPA in SEE in Science was 3.87 and this was achieved by Suresh Chaudhary and Sujan Dhakal. The highest average GPA in SEE in HPE was 3.84 and this was achieved by Shyam Sundar Jha.

Triyog achieved 66.49 percent in average in external test in the Basic Education Examination (BEE) of 2075 and was awarded as Second Highest Average Result Achiever of Tokha Municipality. Similarly, Triyog achieved 3.55 average GPA in SEE of 2075 and was awarded as Second Highest Average Result (GPA) Achiever of Tokha Municipality.

# Triyog Project Bags First Runner-Up Position at National Social Business Challenge

Digital Saathi, a joint social impact venture initiated by Triyog High School and Rural Development Initiative, was adjudged First Runner Up at the 4th National Social Business Challenge (NSBC) 2019, an initiative of Yunus Social Business Center, King's College, jointly organized by United Nations Development Program (UNDP), Youth Co:Lab, Association of Youth Organizations Nepal (AYON), and National Youth Council (NYC) - Ministry of Youth and Sports, co-organized by Himalayan Climate Initiative and Blinc Ventures.

Digital Saathi was rewarded with NRS 50,000 by Hon. Jagat Bahadur Bishwokarma, Minister for Youth and Sports. Digital Saathi Team will also present their idea in Asia Pacific Youth Conference in Malaysia. The presenters were also given an intensive mentoring and a chance to pitch their ideas at King's Incubator.

A total of 154 innovative social business ideas of young aspirants from 12 different cities of the country were shortlisted. Among them, 10 teams got the chance to present their ideas before the jury that consisted of eminent personalities from the field of social entrepreneurship. The Final presentation was held at hotel Yak and Yeti on 28 and 29 August.





# School & Community Awareness Campaign plus School Premises Fumigation

#### PROJECT DAY (KG-GRADE III)

Project Day in the Primary Section is a day to showcase the process and outcome of Project Based Learning of students for a particular unit. On this day the students of KG to Grade III very eagerly presented their learning to parents and teachers.

### KG: Topic- Fruit and Vegetable Market

On 10 September, the children of KG had set up a small market in their class consisting of fruits and vegetables, which they sold to their parents. They also talked about the importance of eating fruits and vegetables. The classroom was brightly decorated with the display of their work done throughout the unit.

#### **Grade I: Topic- My Family**
